The **Essential Skills Achievement Pathway (ESAP)** graduation program provides a personalized learning path that allows students to gain skills to support future learning and work. It is based on the nationally recognized Skills for Success and is designed to lead directly to work or post-secondary.

The Departments of Education and Early Childhood Development and Post-Secondary Education Training and Labour have identified Motor Skills in addition to the 9 Skills for Success.

Proficiency in these 10 skills are reached and evaluated through activities in the classroom, community and workplace.

WHAT HAPPENS IN THE ESAP PROGRAM?

- In collaboration with their teachers, students decide which problem-based learning activities they will complete.
- Problem-based learning activities will take various forms depending on the student's readiness and learning goals.
- Projects and assignments are completed individually and in groups.
- Students track their progress to meet learning goals.
- Experiential workplace opportunities are available and encouraged.

WHO WOULD BENEFIT FROM THE ESAP PROGRAM? A STUDENT WHO...

- Is planning to head directly into the work force upon graduation **or** is planning a post-secondary education in one of the available pathways.
- Is a self-directed learner.
- Is interested in problem solving and working cooperatively with others.
- Would like to be involved in workplace educational experiences.
- Understands that they are responsible for the safety of themselves and others in the class.
